Seeking behavioral health parents/kinship care providers who are peer support providers, and Black, Indigenous People of Color with lived experiences such as representing LGBTQ+ and opioid addiction, mental health or substance use challenges. **PREREQUISITE:** Intro to Cultural Competency/Humility training.

This training series is **free of charge**, for family and peer support providers, and community health worker workforce. Individuals who are on benefits and not working can receive a stipend of \$250 to support their participation. Participants will earn 18 hours of specialty training hours.
